"From our home state of Colorado, it all started while making short term mission trips. These trips were eye-openers to a whole new world that neither of us were accustomed to. After participating in a few of these trips, we knew God wanted us moving forward, giving our

availability, and open hearts to change into a life serving him.

Shortly after this calling, we surrendered our home, possessions, businesses, and even our friends and family, to go to an unknown place where we had to rely only on God. This place was a Children's home in Mexico, where we were grateful to learn so much in so little time. As we look back at those two years, we see God training us for a new assignment. He taught us about Mexico's people, culture and gave us a new language. Most importantly, he taught us how to work with and make relationships with the people. All of this to better prepare us for the next step in our faith, a new assignment leading us to Del Rio.

We arrived in Del Rio in 2015 having faith God would unveil our new assignment. Within weeks of our arrival, a tornado devastated our sister city of Ciudad Acuña, Mexico. We immediately began relief work, which led to long-term recovery work and, more importantly, forming partnerships with the people, pastors, and organizations we continue to partner with today. Over these last five years, God has not only propelled these relationships to kingdom work, but he has grown his kingdom with new followers of Jesus. Because of these relationships, we are privileged to serve so many throughout the year on mission for Him in Del Rio and Acuña.

God has continued to stretch us and leads us in ways that we would never believe ten years ago. As 2021 is upon us, our prayer is to let God continue to stretch and grow each of us into a deeper faith that may lead us to a whole new place and perspective of this world that needs Jesus. We want to thank all of you for your continued support and prayers.
